

## **Funding**

If denied due to financial resources being exhausted, and the individual is in agreement, the individual will be referred for placement at an interim level of care until funding is available or the clinical need for the level of care no longer exists.

**Note:** When alternate placement is made due to financial resources being exhausted the admitting agency will continue to assess the client for clinical need. The admitting agency will be responsible for coordinating with the Blair Drug and Alcohol Partnership, Case Management Unit the referral to the clinically appropriate level of care when funding is made available. Pregnant women will not be placed on a waiting list.

## **Waiting List**

Clients who are placed in alternate levels of care due to financial resources or limited capacity will be placed on a waiting list at Blair Drug and Alcohol Partnership (BDAP). The BDAP Case manager will manage the waiting list and prioritize the admission to services within the benefit limitations and priority populations in the benefit guidelines. Individuals who are admitted to interim levels of care and are on the waiting list for higher level of service are required to stay engaged with the admitting provider until they are transferred to the recommended level of care. Individuals who disengage in services will be removed from the waiting list. Agencies are responsible for reporting the level of engagement to the BDAP Case manager.
