Presentation	<p>-COVID -19 update –BDAP/System-Judy Rosser <i>With increase of COVID-19 cases in Blair County, there have been BDAP staff exposed outside of work and have gone on a 14-day quarantine, per CDC guidelines; management team will be meeting next week to discuss a contingency plan in case of more staff being out; Judy was on a virtual meeting with Secretary Smith for a state-wide update – the state is stockpiling PPE’s for residential treatment facilities and providing information on how to access them</i></p> <p>-Presentation of Scope Grant by Kathleen McHugh, MPH (Project Coordinator, SCOPE Statewide) <i>-Strategies for Coordinating Overdose Prevention Efforts (SCOPE) is a grant that trains First Responders in Blair County on non-traditional services to better promote the health, safety, and well-being of the people in the systems they serve</i> <i>-Grant partnered with first responders: EMS: Hollidaysburg Ambulance Service and AMED; Law Enforcement: City of Altoona PD and Logan Township PD</i> <i>-SCOPE goals are to utilize naloxone for known or suspected opioid overdose in a stigma-free environment; Leave behind naloxone and resources for all individuals at-risk of an opioid overdose; and Ensure First Responder safety and appropriate identification and response to fentanyl, carfentanil, and other dangerous licit and illicit drug exposure</i> <i>-Goals – Develop a train the trainer model to achieve sustainability and facilitate county-wide coordination to identify and connect individuals to treatment and non-treatment resources</i> <i>-Training includes: Pathophysiology of addiction; trauma; adverse childhood experiences; trauma informed care; local recovery speaker; risk reduction; and motivational interviewing</i> <i>-Trainings provided in-person and virtually</i> <i>-Is data-driven; next steps are share data reports with Implementation Teams and Advisory Council (Blair County Overdose Prevention Task Force); Utilize data to identify training and technical assistance needs; and develop and implement law enforcement protocol</i></p>
